Leviticus 17:11

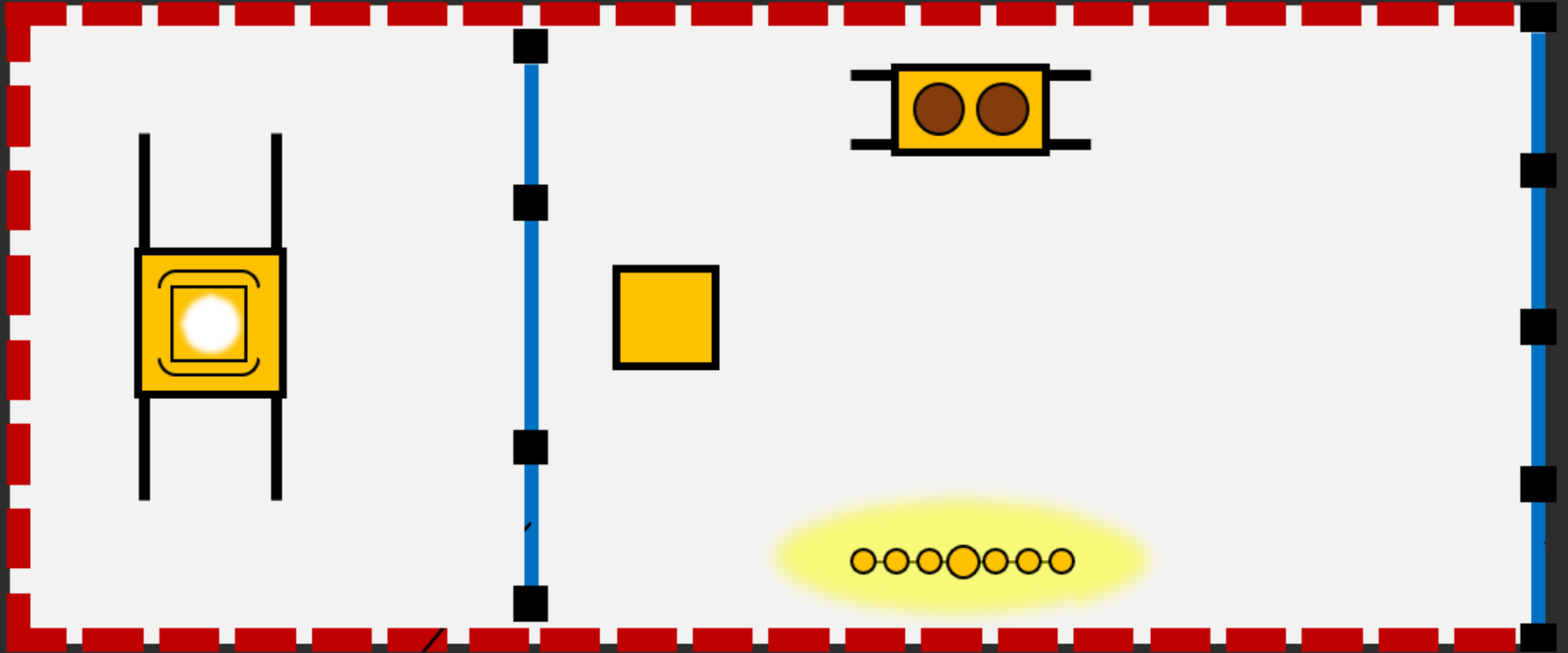


# A Protocol For Worship
